FIND THE PAGE NUMBER

 Helm - nautical usage: a ship's steering apparatus, whether wheel or tiller
 Decade(s) - one decade is ten years
 Vessel - large watercraft like a ship or a boat
 Bow - the front part of a boat or ship
 Maritime - relating to the sea; shipping; sailing in ships; or living close to or working on the sea
 Profits - income from an investment or business transaction
 Quarantine - enforce isolation of people (or animals) that may be carrying a disease
 Malady - illness or condition that requires a remedy
 Peril - danger; exposure to risk of harm
 Commonalities - common features, characteristics, or attributes
 Barrier - a naturally occurring or manmade obstacle preventing passage; an obstacle restraining access
 Seaboard - land near a the sea; a seacoast
 Navigable - passable by ship or boat; deep or wide enough for a ship to pass through
 Contiguous - adjoining, continuous
 Mast(s) - a vertical spar (metal or wooden pole) that supports rigging and sails
 Flybridge(s) - control area on a ship; an open elevated deck of a ship with a second set of navigational devices
 Yacht(s) - a large motorboat or sailboat used for cruising or racing
 Sanctuary - a place where wildlife is protected from predators
 Marsh(es) - soft wet ground; an area of low-lying water-logged land that is often by water and liable to flood
Topography - the features on the surface of an area of land

FIND THE PAGE NUMBER **Indentation -** a notch or recess; jagged edge **Expanse -** a wide area or surface **Crest -** the top part; highest stage Dorsal - on the back of the body Mammal(s) - a class of warm-blooded vertebrates (animals with a backbone) that nurse their young; includes humans, apes, many four-legged animals like cats and dogs, whales, dolphins and bats Submerged - under the surface of the water Prohibited - to stop somebody from doing something by passing a law that forbids it Oyster - a shellfish with a rough irregularly shaped shell (bivalve: shell in two parts); native to seabed of coastal waters Mussel - An edible bivalve mollusk with a blue-black shell that lives attached to objects in the oceans Mollusk - an invertebrate (organism without a backbone) with a soft body usually protected by a shell and living in or near water **Prow** - the front of a ship Kayak - a lightweight canoe propelled by a double-bladed paddle Bushwhacked - to cut a way through thick woods, or vegetation **Retrofitted -** modify something with new parts Hurricane - severe tropical storm with torrential rain and extremely strong winds Foundation - a part of a building, usually below ground, that transfers and distributes the weight of the building onto the ground Extinguished - to put out something that is burning or giving off light Channel - a wide passage of water between an island and a larger body of land; a navigable route Nautical twilight - time of day when the brighter stars used for navigation can be seen, and so also is the horizon still visible Outfitter(s) - a store that sells supplies and equipment for outdoor leisure activities and sometimes provides guides **Brackish** - a mixture of fresh and saltwater Flora - plant life; the plants of a particular region or area Fauna - animal life; the animals of a particular region or area

Periwinkle(s) - a small edible mollusk with a spiral shell; often found clinging to

march grasses

FIND THE PAGE NUMBER **Starboard -** the right-hand side; the right side as you face the bow of a boat Beam (of a boat) - either of the sides of a ship or boat **Stern (of a boat) -** the rear part of a ship or boat Port - the left-hand side; the left side as you face the bow of a boat Jetty(ies) - a wall or barrier built out into a body of water to protect a harbor or protect a shoreline from erosion; or redirect water currents Latin - ancient Roman language Contraction - shortened word **Webbed -** joined by a membrane, or membranes of skin **Plummet -** drop downward fast Gauges - measuring device; measures an amount or tests for accuracy **Pinpoint(ed) -** to identify or locate something accurately **Brood -** to sit on or hatch eggs; young birds Awkward - embarrassing; difficult or uncomfortable to use **Incubation -** hatching eggs by sitting on them or by artificial heat Voilà - from French, an expression of satisfaction **Species -** a subdivision of the study of animals (taxonomy) where all members resemble each other and may interbreed, for example: all dogs belong to the species Canis familiaris **Inland -** not near a coast Plunges - move suddenly downward; put something quickly into something Perch - (verb) sit precariously somewhere; (noun) any temporary resting place Panhandlers - individuals who beg for money or food from passerby Pier - a vertical structural support; the term is used for a walkway jutting into the sea: Tybee Pier Handout - something given as charity to someone (some creature) in need Incubate - keep eggs warm so the embryos (earliest growth stage) inside can develop and hatch Pesticide - a chemical substance used to kill pests, especially insects **Prohibition -** an act or order that forbids something **Endangered -** species threatened by extinction (dying out) Marine - of the sea; relating to or living in the sea

FIND THE PAGE NUMBER Invertebrate(s) - animal without a backbone (like insects, worms and much marine life that does not require a backbone for standing on land) Strategically - in a useful way Erosion - the gradual destruction or reduction and weakening of something **Current -** a steady flow of water (or air) in one direction **Vegetation -** the mass of plants growing in a particular place Stabilization - the action of making something stable, causing it to become steady or firm Boardwalk(s) - a raised walkway made of boards, often built along beaches **Molesting -** to pester, bother or disturb Picturesque - visually attractive, seeming fit for a painting or photograph Condominium(s) - individually owned apartment on land held in common by the owners Eclectic - varied, made up of a variety Surmise - to conclude that something is the case based on limited evidence, to make a guess Cow(s) - large female mammal; whale, seals, moose, oxen **Umbilical cord** - tube connecting the fetus (baby) to the placenta (mother's womb) through which nutrients are delivered and waste expelled during pregnancy Entourage - a group of special individuals who surround, care for, and protect an individual of importance Armada - a large fleet of ships **Intrigue -** to make somebody greatly interested or curious Affinity - a natural liking for or identification with somebody or something Offshore - in a body of water at some distance from the shore Wake - the track left in water by a vessel or other body moving through it **Consume -** the act of eating Squid - an ocean creature that has two long tentacles and eight shorter arms, a long tapered body, two triangular fins and an internal shell Crustaceans - an invertebrate animal with several pairs of jointed legs, a hard protective outer shell, two pairs of antennae, and eyes at the end of stalks. Lobster, crab, shrimp, and crayfish are examples

Hierarchy - the categorization of members of a group by order of importance

FIND THE PAGE NUMBER **Convoluted -** having many twists, coils or whorls _ Cell(s) - basic unit of a living thing Frequencies - rate of recurrence of a wavelength; how sounds are transmitted and received Signature - distinctive mark, sound, look, or characteristic that identifies somebody **Descriptive -** expressing an attribute; having particular qualities **Converse -** have a conversation **Convey -** communicate something **Blubber -** the insulating fat of whales and other large ocean mammals Imitation - can copy or reproduce a movement or action; mimicking **Memorization -** learn, commit something to memory Foresight - the ability to think ahead; envision possible future obstacles or problems Elaborate - complex; having many different parts or a lot of detail **Simultaneously -** at the same time Minesweepers - ship fitted with equipment to detect explosive mines **Vagaries -** unpredictable changes Octagonal - eight-sided shape **Pile(s)** - a sunken support for a building or structure **Scheme -** systematic arrangement Flagstaff - flagpole Nave - central part; hub **Encroach -** to exceed the proper limits of something Lap(ping) - to flow or splash gently against a surface **Efficacy -** the ability to produce the desired result Confederate - a supporter or soldier of the Confederate states of America during the Civil War **Union -** a supporter or soldier of the Union states of America during the Civil War First-order lighthouse station - a lighthouse with the largest of the six Fresnel lens sizes (additional sizes and applications of the Fresnel lens were later developed

including widespread use in automotive lights)

FIND THE PAGE NUMBER Masonry - the stonework; stone or brick parts of a building **Disintegrated -** break into fragments; undergo destruction to destroy the wholeness of something Frostbite - damage to body extremities (hands, fingers, feet, toes typically) caused by prolonged exposure to freezing conditions **Altitude -** height above sea level Simulated - made in imitation of a genuine article; feign; pretend **Nuclear -** an explosion produced through fusion or fission **Detonation -** the explosion or act of making something explode Armament - the guns and other weapons on a military aircraft, vehicle or ship Conventional explosive - substance or device that produces a volume of rapidly expanding gas Uranium - radioactive element; can be used as a fuel in nuclear weapons and nuclear reactors (energy producing plants) Plutonium - radioactive element; used in production of atomic weapons and atomic energy Dredging - digging underwater using a machine equipped with a revolving chain of buckets, a scoop or a suction device for digging out and removing material from under water Tankers - a ship (truck or airplane) designed to carry large quantities of liquid or gas **Trinidad -** island in the Caribbean; part of Trinidad and Tobago **Tobago -** island in the Caribbean; part of Trinidad and Tobago Italy - country in southern Europe. Its mainland area projects as a peninsula into the Mediterranean Sea; generally thought to have a land mass shaped like a boot Asia(n countries) - the world's largest continent, bordered by the Ural and Caucasus Mountains and Arctic, Pacific, and Indian Oceans China - country in East Asia, largest by population, third largest by land mass **Pulp -** crushed wood or other materials that are used to make paper Panama Canal - a navigable canal built across the isthmus of Panama in 1914 **Isthmus -** a narrow strip of land that joins to lager areas of land

FIND THE PAGE NUMBER Habitat(s) - the natural conditions and environment in which a plant or animal lives Tractor-trailer rig(s) - truck for pulling heavy loads, consisting of a tractor attached to a trailer or semi-trailer Gullah - people of African descent who live along the coasts of South Carolina, Georgia, and northern Florida and on the neighboring Sea Islands; the Creole language of the Gullah people; a form of English that has been influenced by sever al West African languages. John F. Kennedy, Jr. - son of the 35th president of the United States (1961-1963) **Remote -** situated a far way away Caterer(s) - person or persons who provides what is wanted or needed in a particular situation, or by a particular group of people Ferry - a boat used to transport people, vehicles, or goods across water, especially one operating regularly across a river or narrow channel Strategic - done for a particular reason or strategy, implementing a carefully devised plan to meet a particular goal Robert E. Lee - commander of the Confederate Army in the Civil War **Compromised -** exposed something to danger **Secede(d) -** to make a formal withdrawal of membership **Impenetrable -** impossible to get in or through **Batteries -** a group of artillery pieces such as guns or canon (or missile launchers) that function as a single tactical unit Fortifications - a position or place that can be defended **Blockade -** an organized action to prevent people or goods from entering or leaving a place **Telegraph -** method of long-distance communication by coded electric impulses transmitted through wires **Stranglehold -** power over something or somebody that is complete and prevents any movement or change **Courier -** official messenger like a diplomat or solider, also a secret messenger; someone who delivers documents and small packages by hand **Invincible -** to strong to ever be defeated **Garrisons** - place for station troops; a body of troops stationed at a military post **Optimistic -** positive attitude; hopeful view of future outcomes

FIND THE PAGE NUMBER **Akin -** similar or closely related to something **Brash** - self-assertive in an aggressive way **Mortar(s) -** cannon with a relatively short and wide barrel **Gaping -** large opening, wide open and deep **Powder magazine -** stock of ammunition, stock of gun powder **Direness -** serious or desperate circumstances **Economic -** relating to the business activities of a country **Relic -** something that has survived from a long time ago **Milestone -** significant or important event Musket - a shoulder gun with a long barrel and a smooth bore (bore: internal diameter) Oft-buffeted - oft: often; buffeted: repeated blow or stroke Ozone - gaseous form of oxygen with three oxygen atoms per molecule (regular air has just two) Embellished - to make a story more interesting by adding details which may not be true Eccentric - unconventional in a whimsical, unpredictable or amusing way **Salutation(s) -** gesture or phrase used to greet **Danciful -** curiously made, based on imagination or dreams **Promulgate(s) -** to make something well known **Notion -** idea, opinion or concept **Purportedly -** claiming to be something, claiming to be truth Woo(ed)- to seek the love or affection **Matrimony -** marriage Lothario - man seeking to enter into short-term love relationships with women; named from a character of this personality in a play from the mid-18th Century Metaphorically - using a comparison or symbolism to describe something **Hone -** improve something

FIND THE PAGE NUMBER **Dastardly -** mean Clutch - group of eggs laid together by the same bird at the same time **Dissuade -** to persuade someone not to do something **Environmentalist(s) -** someone working to protect the natural world Scant - "less than scant" means fewer than few **Refuge -** shelter, a protected place for animals Conscience - sense of right and wrong Adverse - unfavorable or harmful Stewardship - protection of something considered worth caring for and preserving **Allure -** an attractive quality Nonchalance - indifference; seeming lack of concern for situation or events **Sultry -** very hot and damp **Participatory -** event with active participation by those in attendance Palpable - emotional response so intense as to be almost physically felt **Protracted -** lasting a long time **Swashbuckling -** adventuring Aborigine - native from the earliest known inhabitation of an area
